As we close on the Summer season of plentiful gardens, we give thanks for all of the fresh vegetables we were able to produce for many families in need. We provided many varieties of vegetables to the food pantry. We thank all the wonderful volunteers that worked hard in the garden this year.

We have had a wonderful year at the Ada Street location. We have taken over almost 6,000 pounds of cabbage, potatoes, tomatoes,



green beans, okra, yellow squash, butternut squash, bell peppers, and sweet potatoes to the local Food Pantry.

The Ada Street farm is a beautiful location and we are so thankful to the Fannin County School Board for allowing us to be here.

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# Master Gardener Advice - Organic Mulch

Mulches are useful additions to landscapes for several reasons. Many plant wastes can be recycled as organic mulches that aid plant growth in several ways.

Mulches reduce weed-growth around plants. Organic mulches, such as wood chips, must be three to four inches thick to effectively keep weeds down. Organic mulch eventually breaks down improving soil, which means you'll need to replace it after several years.

Mulches save water in the garden because they reduce evaporation from the soil surface. Inorganic mulches, such as rock, can also hold in moisture. Mulches also improve water penetration and minimize soil crusting.

Some people prefer to use spun or woven landscape fabric under wood chips or gravel. Unlike solid sheet plastic, which is no longer recommended, these materials promote air and water exchange within the soil.

Allotment holders met to discuss how to proceed now that everyone has enjoyed a bumper crop of what they planted. We were advised to plant some winter crops such as broccoli and collards from plants rather than seed.

This program combines a unique gardening-based curriculum and instruction, community service, character education and service based learning. Members will become certified Junior Master Gardeners at the conclusion of the year long program. The program is geared for youth ages 8-10. It is designed to incorporate science, math, language arts, and nutrition into "hands on" gardening, arts and crafts and food preparation activities. # **Food Pantry Distribution**

Thanks to a bountiful garden at Ada St this year, the Feed Fannin volunteers have been picking fresh vegetables since July 7th and taking them to the Family Connections Food Pantry. Faith Presbyterian Church and Cherry Log Christian Church also grew over 1,100 pounds of produce for Feed Fannin.

Once the produce is delivered to the Food Pantry, volunteers weigh everything, then wash or wipe the vegetables before distributing to the families.

As part of our sustainable foods program, Feed Fannin began supplying the Food Pantry with dozens of fresh eggs each week. We started with 60 dozen and are now supplying 90 dozen every week.




Volunteers clean and sort all produce before it is placed in the boxes.


